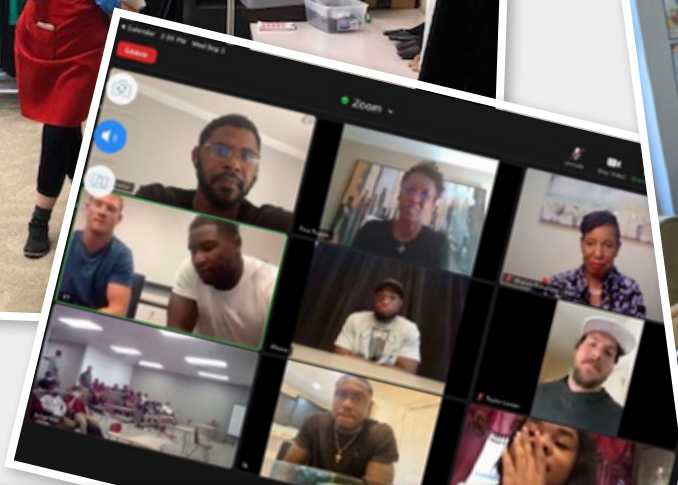
Our staff at the Weaver Center and throughout our community programs have worked tirelessly throughout this time. I am so incredibly proud of their dedication and commitment to the work.

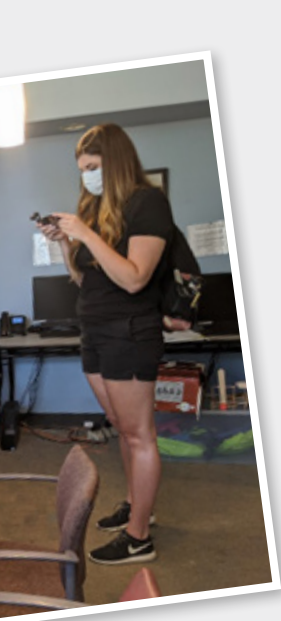

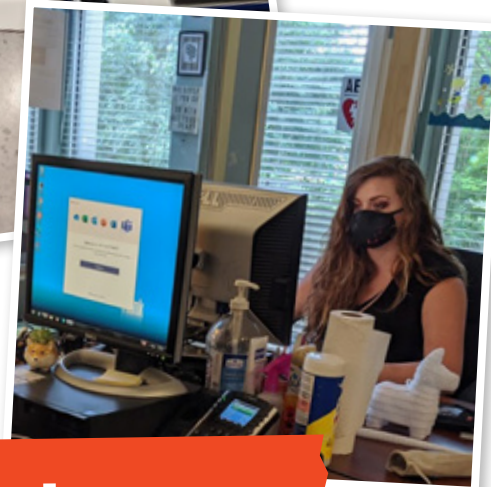

Domestic Violence Services

YWCA helps break the cycle of domestic violence by offering a continuum of services, including the 24-hour Crisis & Support Helpline and Textline, the 65-bed Weaver Domestic Violence Center, case management, adult and children's counseling, shelter and community based support groups, community education, transitional housing, and Re-New at the YWCA.

Re-New was founded in 2010 to help women who are leaving the Weaver Center jumpstart their lives. The volunteer-run program furnishes and decorates the homes of survivors leaving the shelter. No detail is missed by the Re-New angels. Re-new has impacted countless lives since its founding.

Last year, YWCA served 544 adults and children at our shelter and answered more than 4,200 calls to the crisis line. YWCA implemented a crisis text line in the spring of 2020, the only emergency DV text line in Tennessee.

As the COVID-19 pandemic swept through Tennessee, YWCA saw a spike in calls for help. The doors to the Weaver Center remained open, with frontline staff offering safety and support to survivors of domestic abuse.

Girls Inc. at YWCA Nashville & Middle Tennessee inspires all girls to be strong, smart, and bold through life-changing programs and experiences that help them navigate gender, economic, and social barriers. More than 500 girls benefited from in-school, camp, and online programming last year. The annual summer internship program with Draper James continued and the Chaput-Avery Scholars program was launched at Antioch High School in FY20. The college prep program served 17 youth through in-school programming, leadership workshops, and college campus tours. Kim Boih received the \$50,000 Chaput-Avery Family Foundation Scholarship.

Girls Inc. programming continued even after the pandemic forced schools to shut down, with clubs and camps moving online.

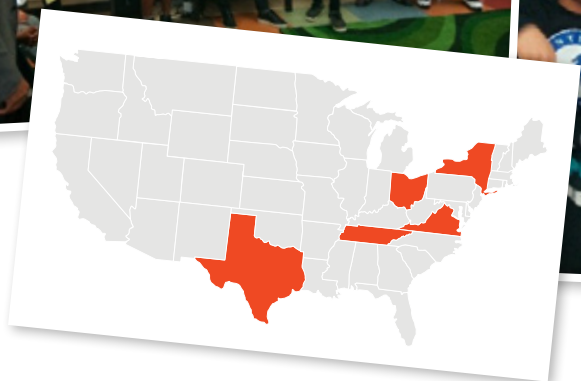
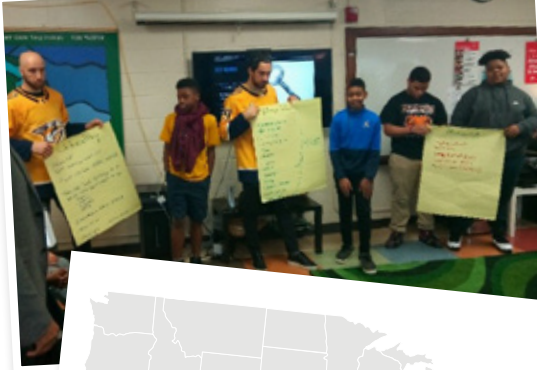

AMEND Together

AMEND Together is YWCA's community-based primary prevention program dedicated to ending violence against women and girls by engaging men and boys to challenge a culture that supports violence, cultivate healthy masculinity, and change the future for women and girls. Last year, AMEND Together trained more than 2,500 individuals and 10 collegiate programs through our signature workshops and nearly 700 middle and high school students in Metro Nashville.. AMEND Together continued offering youth programming virtually to keep everyone safe during the pandemic.

In FY 2020, AMEND Together officially became a national program, with affiliate partnerships at six YWCAs across the U.S.

Dress for Success Nashville

Dress for Success Nashville transitions women to self-sufficiency by providing professional clothing, a network of support, and career development tools. Last year, Dress for Success provided 125 suitings for women entering or re-entering the workforce. One of the highlights of this program is the annual Salute to Success. Every November, we partner with veterans organizations to outfit women who are leaving military service and transitioning to the civilian workforce.

To keep clients and staff safe during the pandemic, our Dress for Success program began offering virtual and COVID-safe one-on-one suitings and drive thru donation drop-offs.

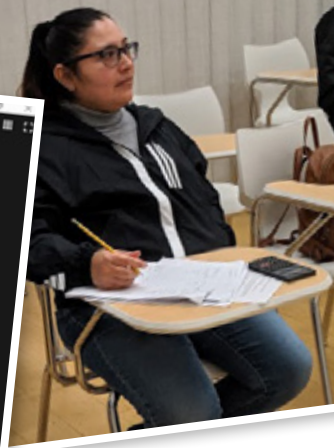
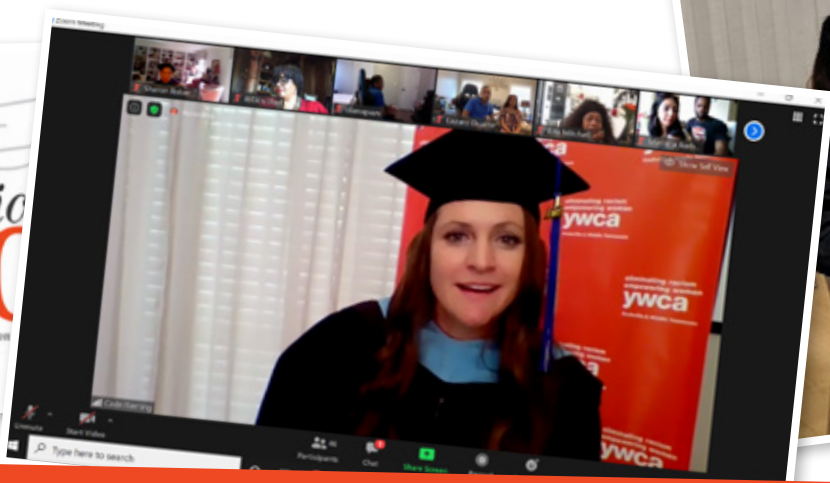

Family Learning Center & Career Services

The YWCA's Family Learning Center offers high-quality, culturally sensitive, comprehensive programming to help families break the cycle of intergenerational poverty and illiteracy. The FLC's free adult education program boasts 25 percent of all HiSET (formerly GED) graduates from the Nashville region. In addition to Adult Education, YWCA's FLC offers a career services program to support our adult learners.

Our teachers and tutors moved instruction online after the pandemic forced in-person classes to be suspended. Students have welcomed this new and convenient way to learn, and enrollment continues to climb.

Social Justice & Advocacy

As the oldest and largest multi-racial women’s organization in the world, YWCA has taken a leadership role in civil and human rights issues for more than a century. YWCA Nashville & Middle Tennessee is actively engaged in advocacy that reduces violence against women and girls, promotes gender equity and racial justice. Our advocacy efforts focus on local, statewide, and national issues that impact the clients we serve. We are fortunate to have an active and engaged Advocacy Committee.

At its heart, YWCA is a social justice agency dedicated to eliminating racism, empowering women, and promoting peace, justice, freedom, and dignity for all. Social justice is embedded into the work we do internally as an organization and externally in the community with our clients and partner organizations. We host an annual Youth Advocacy Training, offer tours of the Weaver Center to elected officials, and participate in Women’s Day on the Hill with our Girls Inc. students. Our legislative advocacy focused on the passage of the Shear Haven domestic violence education for licensed beauty professionals during FY20.

Each year, YWCA hosts the Stand Against Racism, and in recent years, we expanded this one-day event to include a series of community education sessions. During the pandemic, these sessions were moved online and have received significant interest and support.

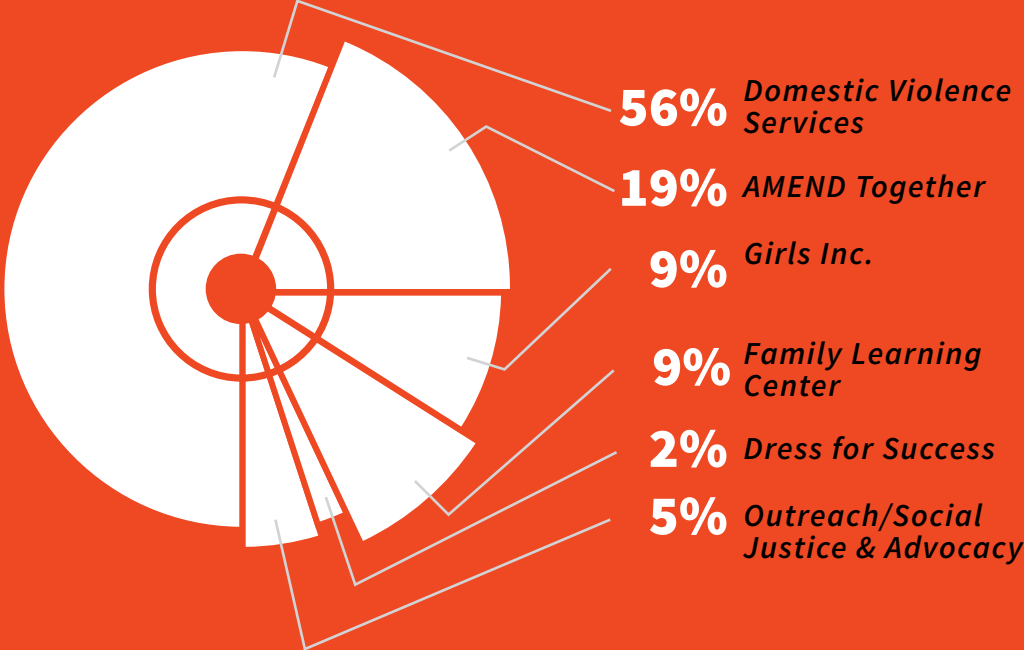

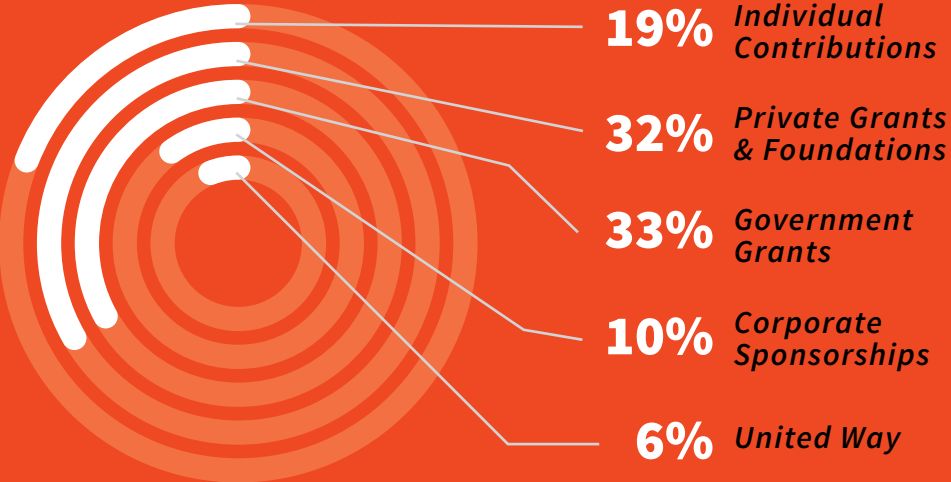
